

## Malaysian Law on Negotiable Instruments

This book is a clear addition to the literature on Negotiable Instruments. It covers rules relating to English and Malaysian laws on bills of exchange, checks and promissory notes.

The salient features of this book are:

  - Acceptance and payment of a bill of exchange for honor
  - Rules relating to lost bills
  - Rules relating to bill in a set
  - Conflict of laws as applicable to bills
  - Definition of a check on a banker
  - Presentment of checks for payment
  - Revocation of banker's authority to pay
  - Crossings on checks
  - Special rules that deal with checks endorsements
  - Promissory notes
- Dealing with English and Malaysian court decisions that illustrate or contrast the rules in question
- Explaining and presenting the provisions of the Malaysian Bills of Exchange Act in a way that generally makes the book suitable for law practitioners, law students and traders or members of the community at large who might be interested in the law of negotiable instruments.
