1. Evaluate the limit if it exists. Justify your answer

(a) 
$$\lim_{x \to 0^+} \frac{x-1}{x^2 + 2x}$$
. (4 pts.)

(b) 
$$\lim_{x \to 1} \frac{\sqrt{x} - x^2}{1 - \sqrt{x}}$$
. (8 pts.)

(c) 
$$\lim_{x \to 0^-} x \sin\left(\frac{\sqrt{x+2}}{x}\right)$$
. (6 pts.)


(d) 
$$\lim_{x \to 1} arc \sin\left(\frac{1-x}{1-x^2}\right)$$
. (4 pts.)

(e) 
$$\lim_{x \to -\infty} \frac{x^3 - 2x + 7}{-2x^2 + x - 3}$$

(f) 
$$\lim_{x \to +\infty} \left( \sqrt{9x^2 + x} - 3x \right). \tag{7 pts.}$$

2. Use the graph of 
$$f(x) = \sqrt{x-1}$$
 to find a number  $\delta$  such that (7 pts.)

$$\left| \sqrt{x-1} - 1 \right| < 0.1$$
 whenever  $|x-2| < \delta$ .



3. Where is the function 
$$f(x) = \frac{1}{1 - e^{\frac{x+1}{x}}}$$
 continuous? (7 pts.)

4. Find the constant k that makes the function

(8 pts.)

$$f(x) = \begin{cases} x^2 - k^2 & \text{if } x \le 2\\ kx + 5 & \text{if } x > 2 \end{cases}$$

continuous on  $(-\infty, +\infty)$ .

5. Show that the equation  $x \ln x = \sin x$  has a root in the interval (1, e). (8 pts.)

6. (a) How many horizontal asymptotes can a function have? (6 pts.) Illustrate your answer graphically.

- (b) Does the graph of  $f(x) = \ln(9 x^2)$  have a vertical asymptote (7 pts.) at x = 3. Justify.
  - (ii) at x = -1. Justify.
- 7. The position function of a particle moving in a straight line is given by the equation of motion  $s(t) = \frac{1-t}{1+t}$ , where t is measured in seconds and s in meters. Find the instantaneous velocity of the particle when t = 1. (8 pts.)

8. (a) **TRUE** or **FALSE**. Justify: If f'(a) exists, then  $\lim_{x \to a} f(x) = f(a)$ . (4 pts.)

(b) Is f(x) = x |x| differentiable at x = 0. Justify. (6 pts.)

(c) Graph the derivative of the function whose graph is given below. (6 pts.)
