• Domain of the function is: {set of all points (x, y) such that $x \neq 0, y \in (-\infty, -1]U[1, \infty)$ }

$$\bullet \quad \frac{\partial y}{\partial y} = \frac{y}{x\sqrt{y^2 - 1}}$$

- $\frac{\partial y}{\partial y}$ is continuous on set of points (x, y) such that $x \neq 0, y \in (-\infty, -1)U(1, \infty)$
- The equation has a unique solution through the given point.
