

- (1) Verify divergence theorem for $\mathbf{F} = r^2 \mathbf{a}_r + r \sin \theta \cos \phi \mathbf{a}_\theta$ over the surface defined by $0 < r < 3, 0 < \phi < \pi/2, 0 < \theta < \pi/2$.

Hint.

$$\nabla \cdot \mathbf{G} = \frac{1}{r^2} \frac{\partial(r^2 G_r)}{\partial r} + \frac{1}{r \sin \theta} \frac{\partial(\sin \theta G_\theta)}{\partial \theta} + \frac{1}{r \sin \theta} \frac{\partial(G_\phi)}{\partial \phi}$$



There are 4 surfaces.

① $\phi = 0 \quad d\phi = 0$

$$dS = -r dr d\theta a_\phi \quad \int \mathbf{F} \cdot dS = \iint 0 = 0$$

② $\phi = \pi/2 \quad d\phi = 0 \quad \mathbf{F} \cdot dS = 0 \quad \int \mathbf{F} \cdot dS = 0.$

③ $r = 3 \quad dr = 0 \quad dS = r^2 \sin \theta d\theta d\phi \bar{a}_r = 9 \sin \theta d\theta d\phi \bar{a}_r$

$$\int \mathbf{F} \cdot dS = \int_0^{\pi/2} \int_0^{\pi/2} 81 \sin \theta d\theta d\phi = 81 \frac{\pi}{2}$$

④ $\theta = \pi/2 \quad d\theta = 0 \quad dS = r \sin \theta dr d\phi \bar{a}_\theta = r dr d\phi \bar{a}_\theta$

$$\int \mathbf{F} \cdot dS = \iint r^2 \cos \phi dr d\phi = 9$$

$$\text{①} + \text{②} + \text{③} + \text{④} = 81 \frac{\pi}{2} + 9$$

$$\nabla \cdot \mathbf{F} = 4r + 2 \cos \theta \cos \phi$$

$$\int \nabla \cdot \mathbf{F} dv = \int_0^{\pi/2} \int_0^{\pi/2} \int_0^3 (4r + 2 \cos \theta \cos \phi) r^2 \sin \theta dr d\theta d\phi = 81 \frac{\pi}{2} + 9.$$
