The OEP Reading Exam Format

- 1) The **object** of the exam is to **test reading skills**.
- 2) All reading exams (for **001** and **002**, **final** and **midterm**) follow the format described here.
- 3) Exams consist of **three** texts, one **seen** (appearing in the relevant coursebook) and **two unseen**.
- 4) The choice of texts reflects a mix of both more technical and more general English, with one technical and one general in content.
- 5) The texts each have a length of **400-600** words.
- 6) The time limit for the exam is **60** minutes.
- 7) The texts are within the parameters of what we expect of our students at 001 and 002, mid-term and final levels.
- 8) The questions are in **multiple choice format**: one correct answer and three distractors.
- 9) Reading skills are tested using the template of **multiple choice questions** shown in the table below, with approximately **10** questions per text (**30** in total).

| 4) Identifying the referents of pronouns. | What does <i>it</i> in Line 114 refer to? |
| 5) Inference of meaning (from context) at word, phrase and sentence level. | Which is the best definition of <i>sensation</i> , as used in Line 47? |
| 6) Inference of implicit meaning. | What do you think is the writer's opinion of personal translators? |
| 7) Identifying cause and effects. | Why did the chicken cross the road? |
| 8) Identifying the purpose of the text. | Why is Ahmed writing to his brother? |
