Q.1. Write a MIPS assembly program to implement the procedure, **BubbleSort**, to sort an array of integers (i.e. 32-bit signed numbers) in an **ascending** order.

The pseudocode for the **BubbleSort** procedure is given below:

BubbleSort (ArrayPointer, ArraySize)

Status = Unsorted

#comprisons = ArraySize-1

while (#comparisons<>0 AND status = Unsorted)

status = Sorted

for (i= 0 to #comparisons)

if (Array[i] > Array[i+1])

swap ith and (i+1)th elements of the array

status = Unsorted

end if

end for

#comparisons = #comparisons - 1

end while

end BubbleSort
```

Store the array to be sorted in variable Array as defined below.

Array: .word 10, 2, 0, 15, 25, 30, 7, 22

Your program should display the following: Array before sorting is: 10 2 0 15 25 30 7 22 Array after sorting is: 0 2 7 10 15 22 25 30

Clearly indicate in your assembly code where each pseudocode statement is translated. Also clearly indicate what registers are used to store the variables.

The solution should be well organized and your program should be well documented. Submit a soft copy of your solution in a zip file. Your solution should be submitted in a **word file** that contains the following items:
