Introduction:

Discussion of the interrelationship of man and space, the basic elements of urban site appearance and composition, urban design concepts and patterns. There will be some emphasis on site analysis techniques and methods, analysis of proportions of open spaces to buildings, relationships of buildings densities, heights and urban appearance. There will also be emphasis on specific Arabic and Islamic urban settings

Course Objectives:

To teach graduate students the different theories and elements of urban form and design. Application of these theories and elements is essential part of this course. Integrating theories with the practical world through the different elements and forms will allow the students to understand urban form and design and its difference from architecture and urban planning.
